- **Bhagyavidya Scholarship:** This scholarship provides a 75% tuition fee waiver granted to meritorious students with outstanding academic records and is applicable for 2% of the students within the sanctioned intake.
- DYPDPU's EWS Scholarship: This scholarship provides a 50% fee waiver for academically deserving students from the Economically Weaker Section (EWS Category annual family gross income of up to Rs. 8 lakhs or less) and is applicable for 10% of the students over & above the sanctioned intake.
- DYPDPU's Elite Sports Achiever: To recognise and reward students with outstanding achievements in sports and to promote sports excellence by providing structured tuition fee waivers to deserving sportspersons. This scheme is applicable for 2% of the students within the sanctioned intake.
- Sukanya Scholarship: This scholarship provides a 25% tuition fee waiver offered to encourage and support meritorious girl students pursuing higher education and is applicable for 2% of the students within the sanctioned intake.
